—With an adult or older teen's help, prepare and enjoy—

Grandma June's Cornbread

Ingredients:

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 cup yellow cornmeal
- 2/3 cup granulated sugar
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 3 &1/2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/3 cup vegetable oil or melted butter
- 1 large egg
- 1 cup milk

Instructions:

(Preheat the oven to 400 degrees Fahrenheit)

- 1- Prepare a 9-inch round cake pan or cast iron skillet by coating with butter or oil. Set aside.
- 2- In a medium mixing bowl, add the flour, cornmeal, sugar, salt, and baking powder. Whisk to combine well.
- 3- Make a well in the center of the dry ingredients and add the oil or melted butter, milk, and egg. Stir just until the mixture comes together and there are only a few lumps remaining.
- 4- Pour the batter into the prepared pan and bake for 20-25 minutes until the top is a deep golden brown and a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean.
- 5- Serve while still warm. Delicious topped with butter and honey!

Can sprinkling salt, sugar, or sand on ice make it melt quicker? Experiment and find out!

Materials:

- 4 equal-sized ice cubes
- 4 equal-sized clear, glass containers such as small drinking glasses
- 1/4 teaspoon each of table salt, sugar, and sand
- Timer such as a clock

Directions:

- Place the 4 containers on a table indoors, out of sunlight or other sources of heat.
- Place each ice cube inside a separate clear glass container
- Sprinkle one with salt, one with sugar, one with sand, (Leave one plain to be your control object.)
- Check every 10 minutes to see any changes. You might want to take photos at different points in the experiment.
- Which melted the fastest?
- After the experiment is complete, research the reason for the fastest melting by typing the following question in an online search engine:
- "Why does (name of whichever ingredient you found melted the ice quickest) melt ice quicker?"
